

















PART 1: Task Steps

1. **Research & Brainstorm:** Look into your assigned topic. Find interesting facts or stories you want to share with your audience.
2. **Choose Your Format:** Decide how you want to present your information. You can choose:
 - **Audio or Video** format.
 - **Interview Podcast** (Groups of 3)
 - **Conversation Podcast** (Groups of 3 or 4)
 - **Storytelling Podcast** (Personal stories or myths)
 - **Educational Podcast** (Teaching us something new)
3. **Plan the Style:** Remember the key features of a good B1 podcast:
 - **Clear structure** (Intro – Main Part – Outro).
 - **Simple, everyday vocabulary** so everyone understands.
 - **Slow and clear speaking** (don't rush!).
 - ...
4. **Record & Upload:** Record your episode and upload the link (or file) to your **Canva presentation slide**.

!!!Tip: Try to sound natural! Don't just read a script—imagine you are talking to a friend.

On your slide, please add:

-  **Your audio podcast**
-  **Title of your podcast episode**
-  **Your name (host)**
-  **One picture** (about your topic)
-  **Short description (2–3 sentences)** – What is your podcast about?
-  **3 key words or phrases** from your podcast
-  **One listening question** (for classmates)
-  **One short quote** from your podcast
-  Podcast icon / microphone icon / sound waves (for design)

Part 2: Oral Presentation & Classroom Showcase

After you finish your Canva slide and record your podcast, you will present your work to the class. Here is your guide for a successful oral presentation:


Presentation Flow (What to say)

1. **Introduction:** Introduce yourselves and your topic.
 - *Tip: Don't read the info from the slide yet – keep it as a surprise!*
2. **Sources & Research:** Tell us where you found your information. Which websites or books did you use?
3. **AI Integration:** Be honest and transparent! Explain what you used AI for (e.g., brainstorming ideas, checking grammar, or creating images).
4. **The Main Event:** Play your podcast for the class.
5. **Personal Reflection:** After the podcast, share:
 - What is the most interesting thing **you** learned while researching?
 - Are there any changes or new habits you will start because of this topic?
6. **Q&A Session:** Ask the class if they have any questions, answer them, and say "Thank you" to finish.

!!!Quick Tips for Success:

- **Eye Contact:** Look at your classmates, not just at the screen.
- **Voice:** Speak loudly and clearly so the person in the last row can hear you.
- **Body Language:** Try to look relaxed and confident – you are the expert on your topic!
